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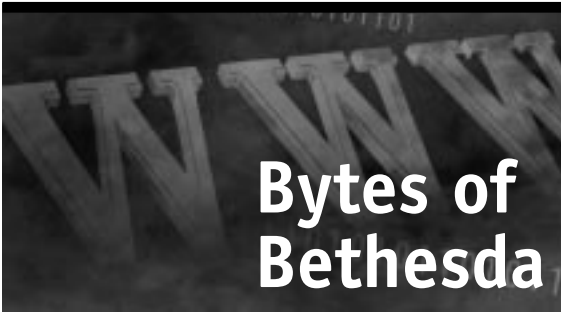

Belts and Suspenders

Making a web site open to everyone is easy – but often ignored by web designers. The simple addition of images with alternative text, consistency of design and link colors, and printable and text only versions of your content will make your site more accessible – and more welcoming.

Use the belt and suspenders method of design: figure out the different ways people will approach and use your site — then give them the chance to do it their way. If your clientele is 25 years old, give them some flash and jazz. If your business is aimed at the over 55 crowd, give them the chance to get your message with a little less technical wizardry, but with all the Technicolor.

“Okay,” you say, “but will my site still stand out from the crowd?” Yes. Featuring the work of your graphic designer or web programmer is not the best way, however. Attracting and keeping customers through ease of use is. Intuitive navigation, breadcrumb trails, underlined links, effective use of white space, and limited collection (and use) of personal data are all ways to make your site memorable.

Distinction in web sites comes from well-written copy; crisp, clear fonts and graphics; superior navigation; and attention to detail, not the least of which is ‘Have I made it easy and comfortable for visitors to my site?’ Email Gayley Knight at gayley@conlinks.com for other, simple ways to design for customer retention.

May 23, 1945 - November 2, 2001

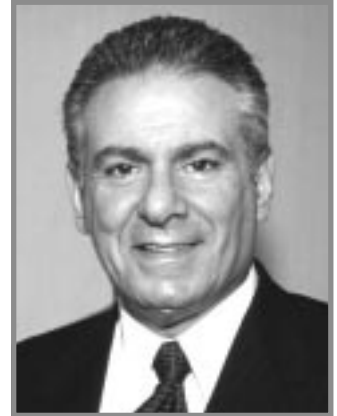

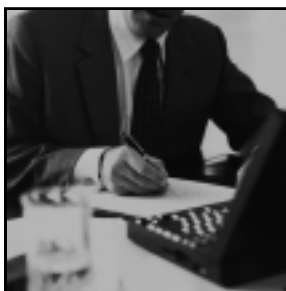
