Remote Connections By Martin Posse, Altronics Communications, Inc.

These days, getting connected to one's data files from remote locations may be crucial, regardless of job title or function. Whether traveling for business or working from home, most occupations require some form of remote connectivity. Usually, there are two ways to connect to an office from outside the physical building. The first option is often a VPN (Virtual Private Network) connection. Through VPNs, the user works on a personal or local computer, and accesses the organization's data through the VPN connection. These are often in the form of shared drives on your office's server. VPN's include a VPN server (integrated on your broadband router, a software implementation on your server or a third party service provider) and a VPN client (Dial Up Connection, VPN client software, or another VPN router – also called endpoint). However, VPNs have technical difficulties that may need to be addressed. First, one needs to ensure that security is in place, including protected encryption keys or carefully planned open ports in the router. It is suggested to have IT support help secure the VPN.

An alternate remove connection option involves remote access and control of an office computer. In this case, one would connect to the remote

computer and use it as if sitting in the office. Lastly, there are many online services that would do the trick. The benefit is that they use an encrypted connection to the provider that works over your regular internet connection and you don't have to do any special configuration on your router.

Legislative Update By Ron Resh, Esq., Public Affairs Consultant



Top Priorities Receive Key Support -

Early November saw significant progress for two of the Chamber's top priorities. After several years of planning and discussion, numerous public hearings and worksessions, the Woodmont Triangle revitalization project was approved by a key committee of the County Council and forwarded to the full Council for action. We anticipate that final approval will occur before the end of the year.

On the transportation front, construction is underway on the County's portion of the Montrose Parkway. A state constructed interchange at Rt.355 and Montrose Parkway is a critical component of this project. Both the County Council and the County Executive have officially advised the state that this is the County's top road priority and as such it should receive expedited state funding.

In addition to testifying in support of the Montrose Parkway, our Chamber focused on several other state issues at recent priorities hearing conducted by the Montgomery County senators and delegates. We continued to support a balanced transportation system utilizing both roads and transit. We urged that funds withdrawn from the State Transportation Trust Fund and used for other purposes over the years be replenished. We encouraged the Administration and the General Assembly to develop a plan to ensure on-going transportation funding. We reemphasized our support for Georgetown Branch Light Rail as part of a broader Purple Line transit project. And we urged continued state support for transit ridership incentives.

Along with our continuous work with the County Council and the Executive Branch at the local level, our Chamber will be very involved in Annapolis with our priority issues when the General Assembly convenes in January.

Under the Economic Development Group are three standing committees and additional task forces, developed on an as-needed basis (i.e. Woodmont Triangle Advocacy Committee). The standing committees include:

- 1. **Economic Development Committee** (Co-Chaired by Kevin Maloney, Maloney & Metz, and Anne Martin, Linowes and Blocher; meets the 4th Wednesday at 8:00 am; Reviews issues, develops the Chamber's legislative agenda and hears from leaders in the community related to doing business in Montgomery County and the region)
- 2. **Parking & Transportation Committee** (Chaired by Patrick O'Neil, Lerch, Early & Brewer; meets the 1st Tuesday at 8:00 am; Focuses on parking policies and transportation issues in the community)
- 3. **Real Estate Committee** (Chaired by David Smith, Chevy Chase Land Company; meets bi-monthly the 4th Wednesday at 9:00 am; Forum for chamber members in the real estate related industries, discussing and reviewing issues related to real estate in the community; sponsors the Annual Real Estate Forecast in June)
